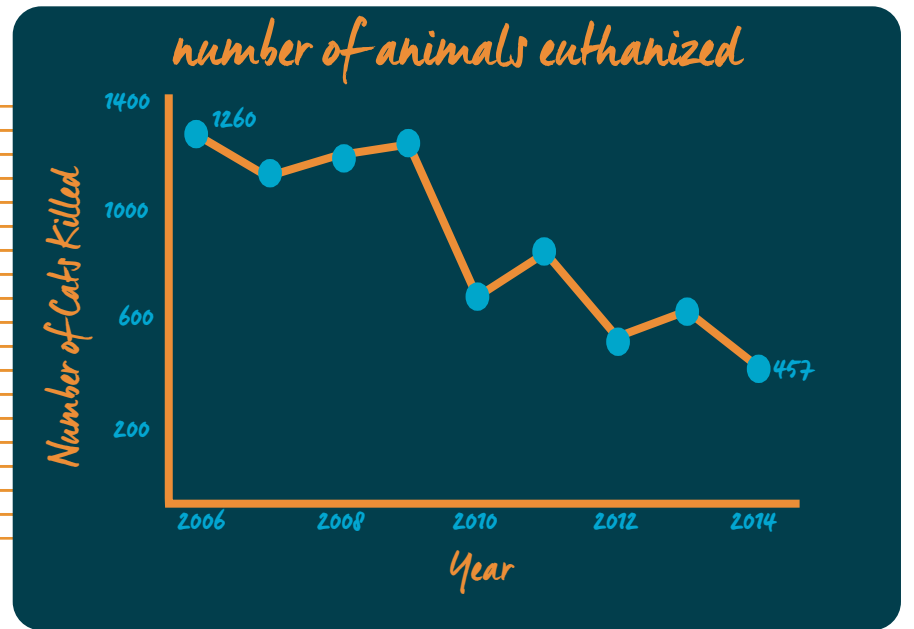
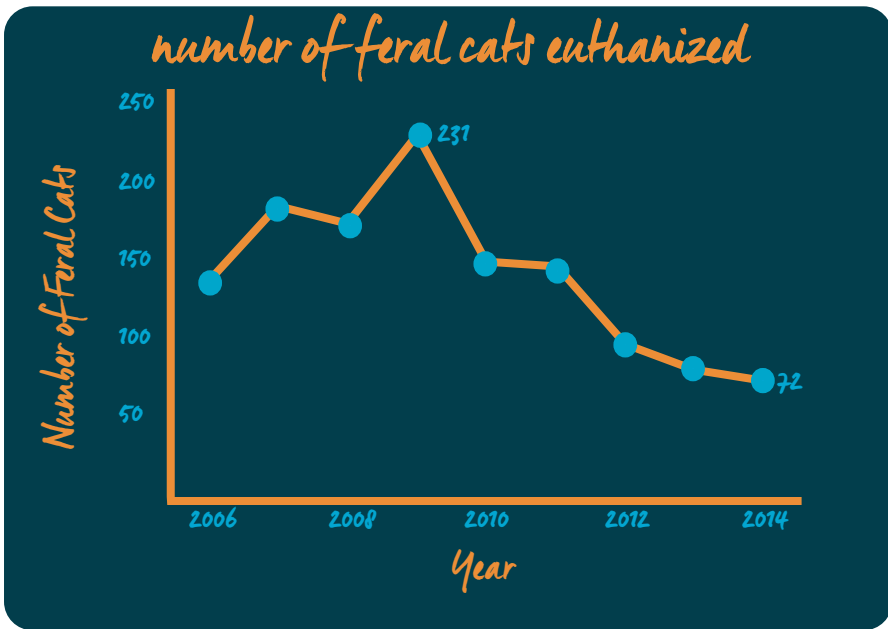


Our mission is to reduce the stray, feral and community cat population through a Humane Solution: Trap-Neuter-Return



Community cat

These cats are not adopted into homes due to lack of human contact. Community cats are sterilized, vaccinated, ear-tipped and returned to their original location.

- ### Feral cat
- Will not approach and will likely seek hiding places to avoid people
 - May crawl, crouch, stay low to the ground, and protect body with tail
 - Unlikely to make eye contact
 - Will probably have a clean, well-kept coat
 - Won't meow, beg, or purr

TNR is the most humane, effective and financially sustainable strategy for controlling free-roaming cat populations.

- ### Stray cat
- May approach people, houses, porches, or cars
 - Might walk and move like a housecat, such as walking with their tail up
 - Will probably look at you, blink, or make eye contact
 - Will probably be dirty or disheveled
 - May be vocal, meow, or "answer" your voice

TRAP NEUTER RETURN

the best solution

T On our pre-determined day to trap at the site, we arrive with traps and sheets to cover the traps once a cat is caught (to calm down the cat).

N We put the trap and cat inside our vehicle and take to the veterinarian where the cat is neutered and ear tipped.

R The following day, we return the cat to the caregiver.
